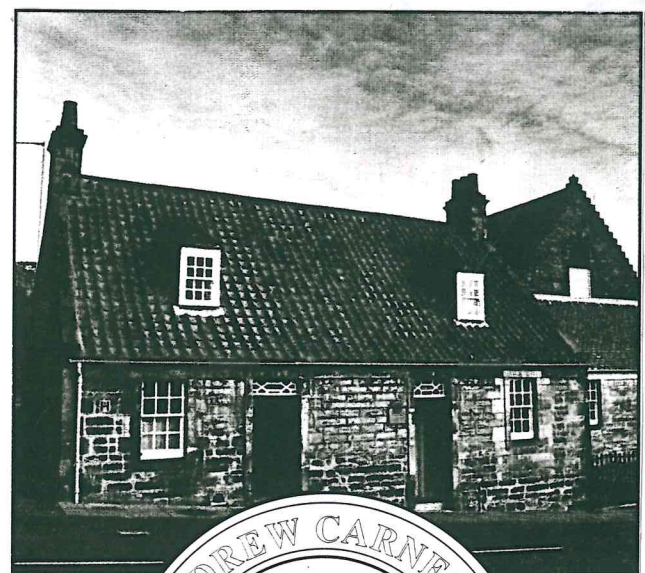

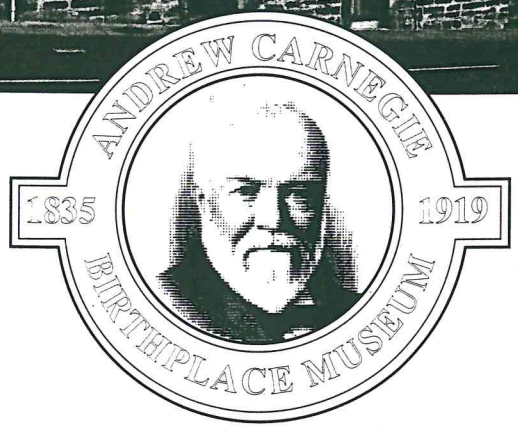


Andrew Carnegie was born in Dumfries in the evening of
Wednesday 25 November 1835.

His parent's names were Margaret
and William. His mother made the
shoes and his father was a weaver,
who is the person that works with
the loom.

He had a little sister, called Ann, who died when she was 2 years old, and one brother, called Thomas. All the family lived in one room in the first floor, because the basement was only for his father's work.



The Birthplace Room

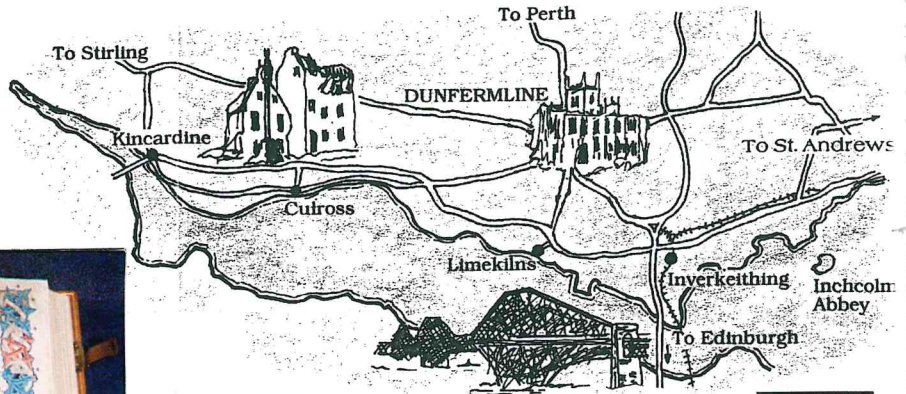
He began the school when he was only 8 years old; that was early for this time; when he left the school at 12 years old, he went in the U.S.A. Then he lived in Charlestown, dimelinks and, with his family, he settled in Pittsburg. His first name was by Annie Aitken, in

Allighenty; in his first job, at the age of 13, he was paid just \$ 1.20 per week. After this job, Thomas Scott offered him a job as his personal secretary and telegraph operator. The salary was \$ 35 a month. He got married when he was 52 years old and his wife was only 30 years old. In this time he was already the Rector of St. Andrews University. He went on to become the head of a vast steel empire, sold in 1901 for \$ 400 million.

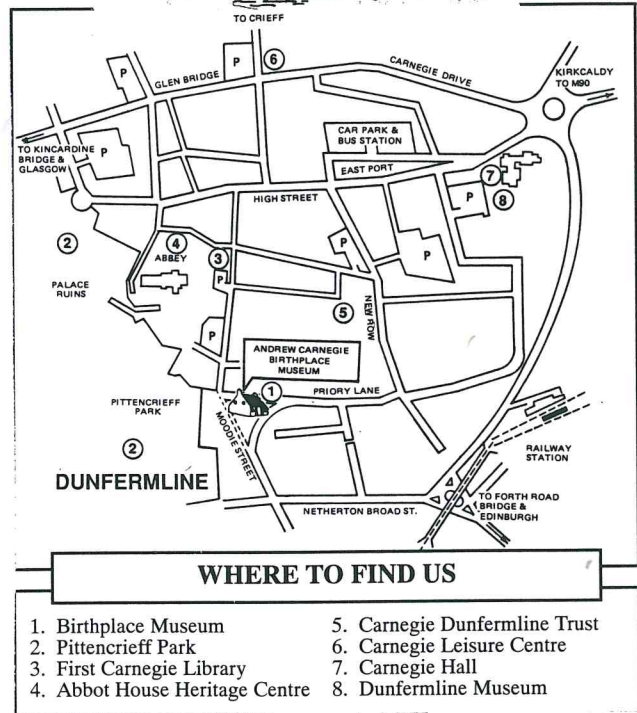

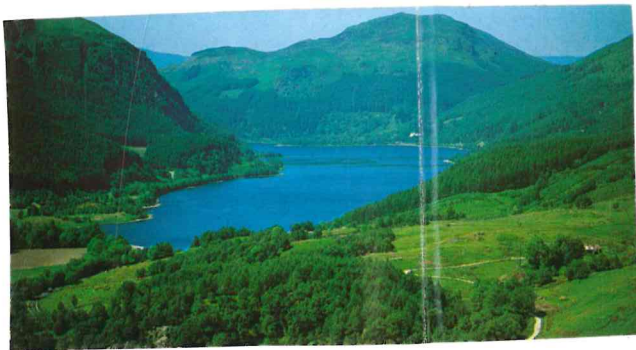
Born in Dunfermline in 1835, this son of a handloom weaver emigrated with his family to the USA in 1848. They settled in Pittsburgh. His first job at the age of 13 paid just \$1.20 per week but by the time he was thirty he was earning almost \$50,000 per year. He went on to become the head of a vast steel empire, sold in 1901 for \$400 million. He died in New York in 1919.

Andrew Carnegie believed that the rich were merely trustees of their wealth and should distribute it for the benefit and improvement of mankind. By the time of his death he had given away \$350 million to provide free public libraries, church organs, schools and colleges and he had established the many trusts and foundations which continue to this day.

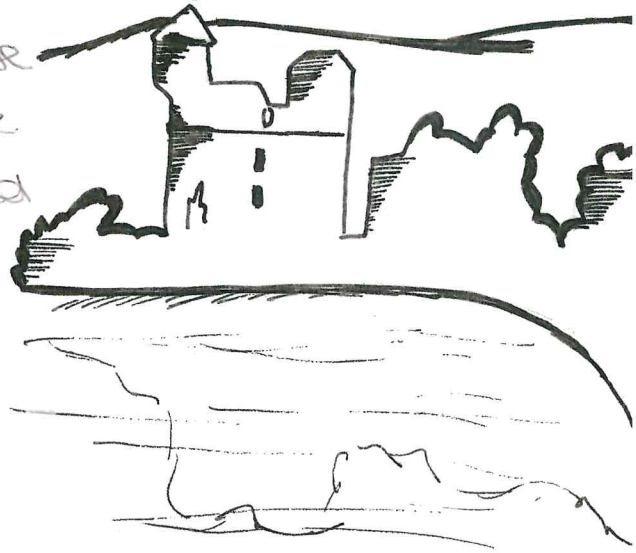
the first impression a visitor gains of Loch Ness is of its extreme size. Loch Lomond has a larger surface area but its islands and twisted shoreline break it up. Here the uniform topography of the parallel shores, with hardly a headland and fewer natural islands to confuse the eye allows one to take in the whole of it at a single, uncomplicated glance. What lies beneath

this two-dimensional image is even more impressive. Huge numbers of fish - notably the salmon, brown trout and sea trout, with a variety of other species live in its depths, and innumerable eels are up to six feet long and in the murky darkness deep down they are pure white in colour.

On the surface ducks and, less often, others are present and in their more playful moments have been known to impersonate the Loch Ness Monster (Nessie) whose meteoric rise to the influence of the south-west wind and the fact that at this narrow neck of Scotland the North Sea and the Atlantic are only about seventy miles apart Loch Ness has several individual climates. The most marked feature of these weather patterns is the variation in rainfall.

The annual precipitation for Drumadrochit is thirty-nine inches, about twelve inches greater than that of Inverness.

As a general rule the rainfall increases by an inch for every mile you travel west along the loch although the graph line rises most steeply as you pass through the 'Cuanre Curtain' for an imaginary line that runs roughly along the east/west watershed.



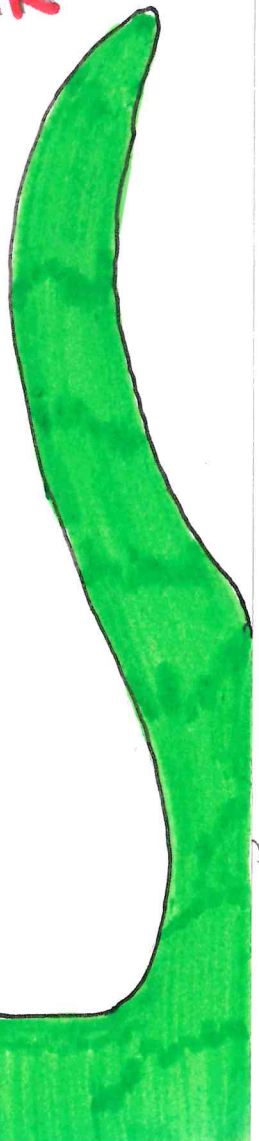
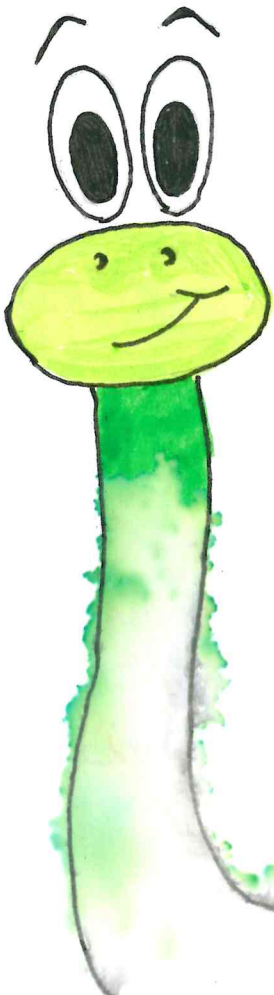

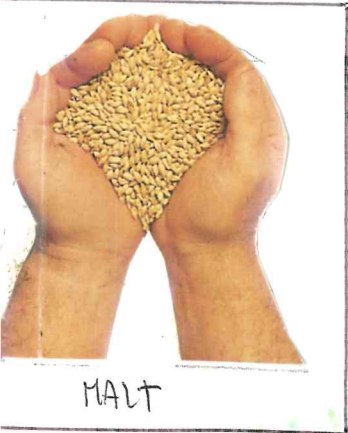
FOOD & DRINK

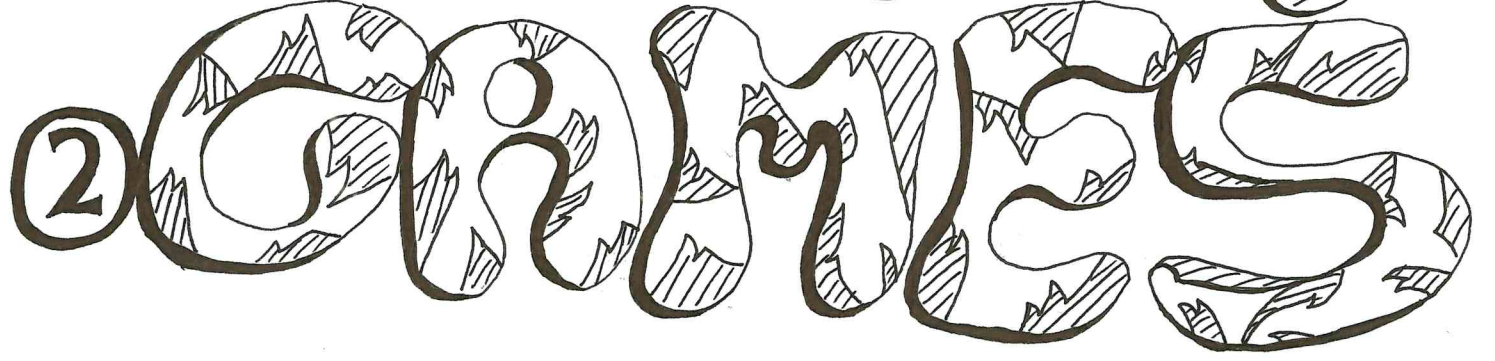
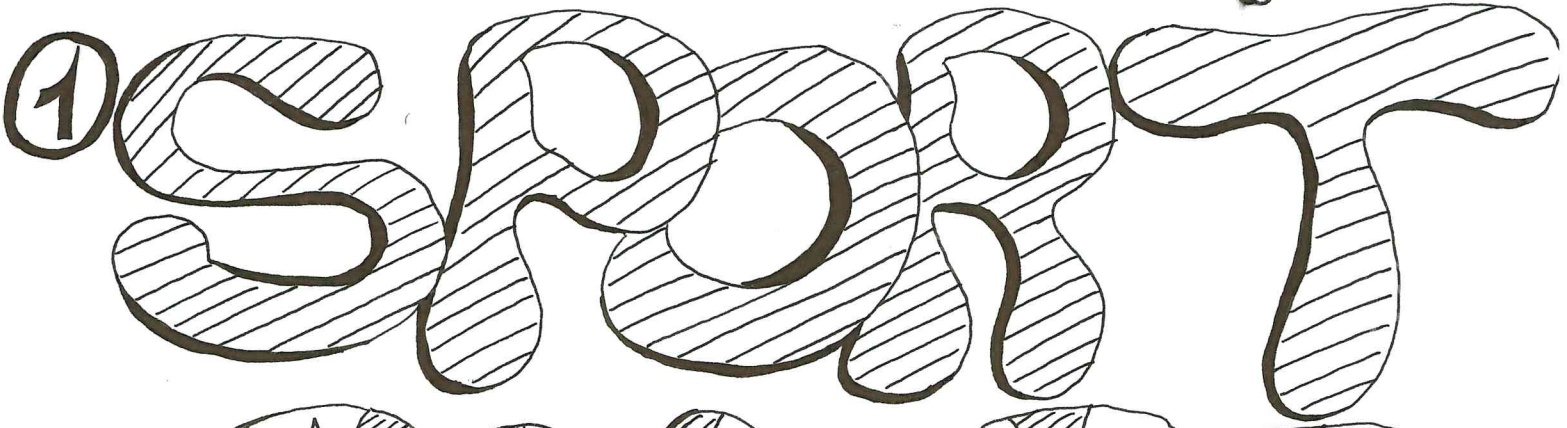

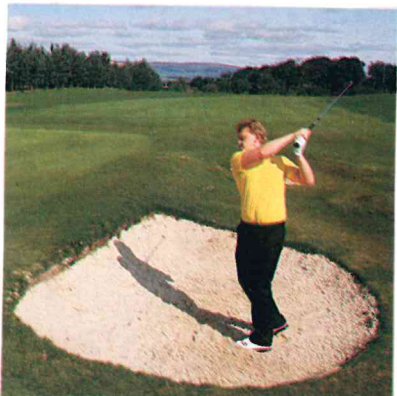

GOLF

There are over 400 courses in Scotland reflecting the country's diverse scenery - links, parkland and moorland. There are more courses per head of population than anywhere else in the world. Although the Open Championship courses like Muirfield, Royal Troon, Carnoustie, Turnberry and, naturally, the Old Course at St. Andrews, as well as Gleneagles and Dornoch, are known world-wide, there are many very attractive but less well known courses which provide a quality golfing experience for the visitor. Costs per round can range from around £5 to over £30 for the better known championship courses. Round and day tickets are available at most courses with weekly tickets available at some. It is often possible just to turn up at a course and play, but usually it is better to telephone in advance to book a tee-off time. A small number of courses need a handicap certificate and/or a letter from your own club. Many hotels offer all-inclusive golf packages and tuition holidays are also available.

WATERSPORTS

The Caledonian Canal and the west coast are just two areas where boats and yachts can be chartered. These can be either skippered or self-sail, but their popularity means they have to be booked well in advance. Windsurfing is also very popular and there are many good areas of water such as Loch Earn, Loch Morlich or Strathclyde Park. Other watersports like jet-skiing, water skiing, white water rafting, canoeing, surfing (especially on the Island of Tiree) and diving are available in many parts of Scotland.



Inland lochs like Loch Tay and Loch Earn have large watersports centres where equipment hire and tuition is available.

Diving is a well established sport with Orkney (because of wreck-diving interest) and the area around St. Abbs in Berwickshire (because of water clarity and diversity of species) just two places providing exceptionally good diving waters.



FISHING

Scottish anglers have a very wide choice of both river and loch fishing, not only for the much-prized salmon, but also for brown and sea-trout, as well as the rainbow trout of stocked and managed waters. The fishing season varies with the river or loch, as well as with the species. Permits are usually bought locally from the post office, hotels, village shops or Tourist Information Centres.



SKIING

There are five ski resorts in Scotland - Nevis Range (on Aonach Mor) and Glencoe in the west near Fort William. Cairngorm (Ariemore) is on Speyside, with Glenshee and The Lecht further east in the Grampian mountains. All five resorts cater for all abilities of skier with plenty nursery areas for beginners and also runs graded from easy to very difficult (i.e. black runs). The Lecht is especially good for beginners and also has creche facilities. The price of daily ski lift passes varies but on average will be about £12. Cross country skiing is available at Glenisla, Glenmore Forest and Glenmulliech. It is often possible to ski in December, however the season usually starts in mid January going on well into April or even May. Sky Schools and equipment hire are available at all the resorts and can be hired on the spot or booked as part of a package.

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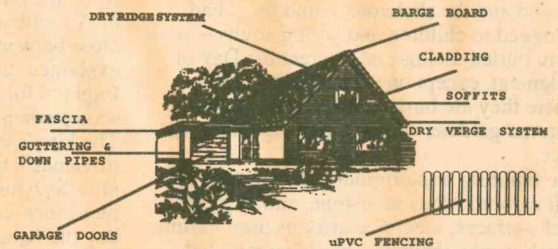

The History

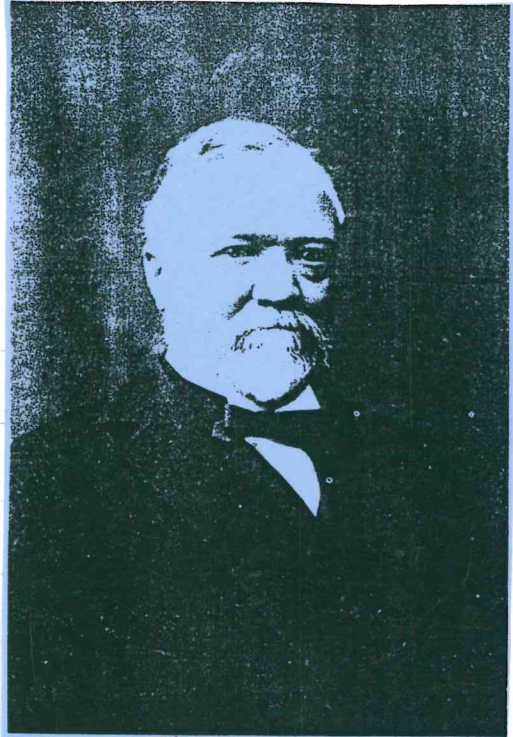
DUNFERMLINE WAS FOUNDED IN THE 8TH CENTURY. ITS FIRST BUILDING WAS KING MALCOLM CANMORE'S TOWER, WHOSE FOUNDATIONS ARE IN PITTERCRIEFF PARK. ON THE TOWER THERE'S DUNFERMLINE MOTTO: LET THIS ROCK BE INACCESSIBLE.

MALCOLM MARRIED MARGARET IN 1069 WHERE UPON SHE ESTABLISHED A CHURCH. THE CHURCH BECAME AN ABBEY, HOUSING A COLONY OF BENEDECTINE MONKS FROM CANTERBURY. THE MOST FAMOUS SCOTTISH KING, ROBERT THE BRUCE, WAS BURIED IN THE ABBEY IN 1329.



DUNFERMLINE'S HISTORY DOESN'T END WITH THE ABBEY: IN FACT IT WAS A FAMOUS PRODUCER OF LINEN DAMASK ANDREW CARNEGIE, SON OF A HANDLOOM WEAVER, BECAME DUNFERMLINE'S BENEFACTOR WITH GIFTS OF PITTERCRIEFF PARK, THE LIBRARY AND PUBLIC BATHS.

IT IS ALSO IMPORTANT TO SAY THAT DUNFERMLINE WAS THE CAPITAL OF SCOTLAND WHEN BRUCE WAS THE KING.

Stirling Castle

Stirling Castle dominates the town as it has dominated Scotland's history.

From Bruce's victory at Bannockburn and the coronation of Mary Queen of Scots. In fact Stirling's colourful history saw William, Earl of Douglas, murdered by James II and his mutilated body hurled from a window in the castle.



Also the castle has strong links with Mary Queen of Scots. She was crowned in the Chapel in 1543 and narrowly escaped death by fire in 1561. Her son, the future James VI, was baptised here in 1566.
